

So happy you asked the panoramic view question! We've been traveling in a Class A motorhome for nine years. We frequently pull our coach into a campsite, rather than back it in, to afford ourselves the view through the windshield. We have a great Newmar, but the curbside features just two small windows. This has frequently been disappointing, especially when weather or insects force us inside.

Storage is very important in a motorhome, but the view is more important. I've added storage to the inside of closet doors, added pantry drawers, utilized organizers and hooks, and even eliminated a large cabinet to move the TV for comfortable viewing, but, the view is why we go in

the first place!

That said, the absolute most important aspect of any motorhome is the quality of its parts and construction. When this fails, nothing else matters. I would love for manufacturers to accomplish both.

#### Classic Views from a Class C

Large windows were definitely on our list of must-haves when we selected our motorhome. Our 24-foot Lazy Daze, with a front-lounge floorplan, has the largest windows we found in any Class C manufacturer. There are two opposing 5½-foot-wide windows in the lounge area, a 4-foot-wide window in the galley, a huge 4½-foot-wide window in the bathroom and even a

2-foot-wide window in the shower stall. Combined with the windshield, we have 360-degree views from anywhere in the motorhome. With the obvious exception of the windshield, the windows are all dual-pane and tinted, so we still have privacy while we enjoy the view.

were in the site the wrong way and offered to help, until we told them why we were parked that way. Once I overheard a discussion between a husband and wife as they set up next to us. He was certain we were hooked to his connections until his wife showed him their connections!

We like views, but realistically, in most sites, large side windows would only result in a better view of the neighbors. A nice rear window might be good in the bedroom, but the front of the motorhome is still the best place to sit and enjoy the view.

The only drawbacks of setting up "backward" is that you have to run the power, water, and sewer lines under the motorhome, and you have to be extra careful not to stumble over them when you exit the motorhome. Carefully placing two ropes on the ground before you pull in helps. I use one to pull the power and water lines, and one to pull the sewer line.

Just a little planning can give you a

More than half the brands didn't have a single offering in their whole product line! Our new Class A offers large windows behind the dinette and the sofa facing each other, and an L-shape kitchen facing the midcoach entry door. This floorplan doesn't trade any storage or space to the view. That's the way we wanted it and we really appreciate it every day when camping with views of the sea, lake, mountain, old town, etc.

# **Active Lifestyle**

I wanted to comment on Mary Zalmanek's "Passion in Action" article in the January issue. While the people and their hobbies were certainly interesting, [the hobbies discussed] were all very sedentary activities. Some of us baby boomers choose more physically active and exciting pastimes that serve to challenge other RVers to stretch their imaginations regarding what they can do.

Personally, I'm a 63-year-old single full-time RVer that just completed training on my new powered paraglider (think go-kart with a large propeller on the back suspended below a rectangular fabric wing for lift). I'm currently building a "second floor" on my flatbed trailer so that I can winch the quad (the "go-kart" part) over the car for transport to warmer climes for flying. The wing portion (officially called the "glider") gets stuffed into a large bag and is carried onboard the RV. The powered paraglider requires very little flat ground for takeoff and landing so, as you travel down the road and see something interesting, you can pull over and launch and fly over your interest!

It's an exciting and burgeoning sport. In fact, the week before my training, a 74-year-old gentleman from San Diego had just completed his own training.

## **A Second Opinion**

I recently purchased the TireTraker TT-500 for my six RV tires before going from Virginia Beach, Virginia, to Tampa, Florida. I am very pleased with Tire-Traker's performance, and also very appreciative with the fast and detailed helpful response of a TireTraker service tech when I emailed TireTraker with a question about the difference in my PSI readings and the air gauge I had been using. The tech, named Jeff, told me something I had never heard: Most tire shops can check my gauge against their calibrated gauge/ machine. By doing so, I could come very close to knowing exactly where I stood regarding my tires' PSIs.

The reason this was so important is because my tires are 295/75R 22.5, 16-ply rated, and call for 120 PSI at a cold temperature due to the weight of my RV (16 tons). Most RVs call for 110 PSI or less, which is easier to take care of. A slow leak had developed in one tire, and Harris Tire in Chesapeake, Virginia, turned it into a flat but would not call back to fix the problem that they had caused. Mike's Mobile Tire Service in Virginia Beach corrected the problem Harris Tire had created and gave an immediate, informative and reasonably priced service and cure.

My wife and I were able to monitor all our tire pressures and temperatures in the comfort of our RV during 800 miles of rain and outside temperatures ranging from the low 40s to 80s. Other Class A motorhome owners need to understand the comfort this is, especially after having tire problems. **Steve Wilbraham I Via email** 

#### **Another Cold-Weather Motorhome**

In August 2003, we took delivery of a 2004 Triple E Commander 36-foot motorhome with two slides and nearly every available option on a gas Workhorse chassis. We've logged 180,000 kilometers (nearly 112,000 miles) through 48 states and nine

provinces, crossing the continent a half-dozen times, including a year of full-timing. As Edmontonians (North America's most northerly city with a population of more than 1 million), we needed the very best in cold-weather operation.

We've driven in blizzards, boondocked in snowstorms and experienced more than 20-below weather, but have never had a problem. The Commander is very well-insulated and has two furnaces that also provide heat to the storage compartments. On windy nights at those temperatures we did need to shelter the motorhome to maintain a comfortable interior temperature, and the generator needed to run to keep up battery power, as furnaces draw a lot.

The Commander units were manufactured in Triple E's plant in Winkler, Manitoba, but the company stopped production about a half-dozen years ago and now make the popular Leisure Travel Vans. Many do remain on the road, and they are great for coldweather RVing.

Take a hike with a ranger in Colorado's Rocky Mountain National Park

ocky Mountain National Park in Colorado makes the most of its 415 square miles with soaring mountain peaks, an elevation range of 7,500 feet to more than 12,000 feet and some 355 miles of hiking trails — many of which can be explored on a ranger-led hike. Every Wednesday during the summer season, visitors can experience some of the best Rocky Mountain has to offer by taking a four-hour ranger-led hike from the Glacier Gorge Trailhead, just steps away from a shuttle stop. What a great opportunity to hike to one of the magnificent glacier lakes in the Bear Lake Corridor on the east side of this park!

Our hike along the Loch Vale trail was led by ranger Trevor Cullen. We hiked the 5.7-mile round trip to The

Loch, a breathtaking glacier lake situated at an altitude of 10,190 feet. Along the way we stopped at Alberta Falls and also discussed a number of park issues, including the definition of a designated "wilderness area," and the impact this designation has on the land. Cullen also pointed out many of the trees, rock formations and the wildlife along the way.

Camping is available across the street from Glacier Gorge Trailhead at Glacier Basin Campground. The campground is scheduled to be open May 25-September 11 this year, and offers 150 primitive sites (35-foot maximum length for RVs) and flush toilets.

# Spring Means Salmon

y sister-in-law hates fish — except salmon, which she loves. Salmon is the "anti-fish." The rich pink-to-orange-to-red flesh doesn't taste fishy and even folks who don't like fish are surprised at salmon's delicious flavor. And none is better than Northwest spring salmon.

Salmon is not only tasty, it's healthful. These high-protein fish are loaded with heart-healthy omega-3 fatty acids and vitamin D. Health authorities suggest we eat oily fish like salmon two to three times per week.

The name salmon comes from salmo, Latin for "to leap." If you've ever seen salmon muscularly jump over rocks, rapids and even waterfalls to return to spawning grounds, the name makes perfect sense.

Most salmon species are born in freshwater creeks and rivers and migrate to the ocean and then return to their original freshwater to lay eggs and die. A few landlocked species live in freshwater only. On North America's East Coast, salmon exist in the rivers and streams that feed into the Atlantic Ocean; on the West Coast, they're found in tributaries that feed into the Pacific Ocean. In addition to wild fish, salmon may be farm raised in holding pens.

There are a number of different species of salmon, many with several different names, which can be confusing. Atlantic salmon is found on the East Coast. In the West, chinook salmon (aka king, blackmouth or spring salmon) is one of the largest (weighing up to 30 pounds) and most prized for its delicate orange flesh. There is also coho or silver salmon; chum salmon (aka keta, dog or calico salmon), often fed to sled dogs; sockeye or red salmon, with high oil content and characteristic red flesh, is often smoked; and pink salmon, also called humpback or humpies, a small variety (generally weighing 3-4 pounds) that's commonly canned.

All types of salmon are delicious, but it's chinook salmon caught in the spring that make fishers and foodies swoon. Spring chinook is especially fresh and clean-tasting with a delicate flavor. It also commands top prices.

It's fun to catch your own spring salmon. If you don't own a boat, there are plenty of fishing charters that provide the bait, tackle and know-how. I've caught chinook on charters in both Alaska and on Oregon's Tillamook Coast, and there's nothing more thrilling than bagging a 25-pounder and filling your motorhome's freezer with this delicious fish.

# Crockett Tavern Museum

Most everyone has heard of Davy Crockett, a genuine American hero probably best

known for his role at the Alamo in San Antonio as part of Texas' battle for independence. But his early life may not be as well-known. The Crockett Tavern Museum, located in Morristown in northeast Tennessee, explores the life and times of the man known as "king of the wild frontier."

Crockett and his family lived in east Tennessee. His early years were tough; his family struggled with debt and moved often, but eventually worked to establish a successful tavern. Young Crockett's jobs were to hunt game for the tavern's supper table and to take care of the livestock of tavern guests, which often included cattledrivers and sheepherders.

The tavern is a representative building of the type of structure that Crockett's father would have constructed, and contains furnishings of that period. It sits on the approximate location of the original building, and is open May through October. After your tour, be sure to visit Davy's Trading Post, a gift shop offering pioneer-related items for sale.

# Desert Solitude

Even though Mojave National Preserve is the third-largest National Park Service area in the lower 48 states at 1.6 million acres, it is seldom visited. After the summer heat subsides, this high-desert area is a remarkable place with many varieties of plants, including cactus and a Joshua tree forest, canyons, volcanic cinder cones and sand dunes. The landscape changes as you drive through the different elevations. There are a number of developed hiking trails, including the Rings Loop Trail (1.5 miles), which ascends narrow Banshee Canyon.

Stop at Kelso Depot Visitor Center (check the website for days and hours of operation), view the 20-minute orientation video and tour the historically furnished depot. This rail depot was built in the first half of the 20th century to support the local ranchers and miners.

All of the major sights can be reached on paved roads. There are also graded gravel and dirt roads, which go farther into the preserve, but check at the visitor center for road conditions.

There are two campgrounds in the preserve. Hole-in-the-Wall Campground is at 4,400 feet elevation and has no hookups, but does have potable water and a dump station. Mid Hills Campground, at 5,600 feet, has no facilities other than vault toilets and is not recommended for motorhomes.

A far cry from the air-conditioned casinos, nightclubs and showrooms in Las Vegas, this Nevada gem is a premier outdoor playground

ention Reno, Nevada, and visions of a casino town boasting crowd-pleasing rodeos, hot air balloon races and classic car galas may come to mind. But under its glittering marquee, the "Biggest Little City in the World" harbors a secret identity. Clues are everywhere. With a whitewater park rushing through downtown, a ski resort featuring the highest base elevation in the area, golf courses begging play, and a choice of RV parks, Reno is a premier outdoor playground as well.

# Ride the Rapids

Returning to this former hometown of ours in May, my husband, Greg, and I felt like kids on spring break. The annual Reno River Festival (May 13-14 this year) was hosting the U.S. National Whitewater Freestyle Championships, and the riverbanks buzzed in anticipation.

"Folks, the powder you skied on yesterday is the water you're riding today!" the announcer called out. The river, fed largely by

Sierra Nevada snowmelt, thunders through the city center, crashing over 11 drop-pools in the half-mile-long Truckee River Whitewater Park. Based on a scale of 1 (a lake) to 6 (a waterfall), the course is rated 2-3. Beginners and experts alike enjoy paddling kayaks, inner tubes, rafts and canoes downstream. Boaters launch their watercraft upstream along easily accessible flat-top rocks and boulders. When the pros come to town, these 7,000 tons of installed smooth rocks serve as grandstands.

Fans cheered as freestyle athletes spun kayaks into the air with gymnastic-style spins and cartwheels under the judges' scrutiny. Upriver, a series of paired poles suspended over the tumbling water marked a slalom course. Competitors in carbon-fiber racing boats, kayaks, canoes and creek boats maneuvered through the gates battling currents to stay on course. The boater-

cross, a crowd favorite, drew a large audience as kayakers raced a buoy course to the finish line.

If you're a water sports enthusiast, splash into the city's free water park with your own watercraft, rent one or leave the navigating to an expert on a guided tour. Helmets and flotation vests are required and water temperatures vary seasonally between 50 to 70 degrees. If you're new to the sport, several outfitters can assist with general information, lessons, tours, and boat and gear rentals. #### Climb a Wall

Have you ever dreamed of rock climbing? Venture into BaseCamp Reno at Whitney Peak Hotel and climb its signature 164-foot outdoor climbing wall for a bird's-eye view of Reno's downtown. No experience is necessary for a one-hour attempt to reach the top. Under the watchful eye and belaying (rope management) assistance of a BaseCamp staff member, novices clamber up the wall plant a baginner route detted with

gumball-colored grips and footholds. Sport climbers follow an expert-level path scaling the multipitch wall with a 70-foot climb to the first ledge and a 94-foot ascent to the second.

Not ready to take on the monster wall? Have some fun on the shorter, 35-foot sections with a self-regulating, magnetic braking system called an auto-belay. Climbing is not on my list of fun outdoor activities but, I must admit, this wall tempted me. Watching youngsters scrabble 5 to 10 feet high, hang like bugs on a wall and then

like great fun.

Still not convinced? Practice first with some indoor bouldering in the 7,000-square-foot facility with more than 3,200 square feet of climbable space and cushy, padded flooring. Day-use fees apply, and all climbing equipment is provided for a nominal rental fee. The outdoor climb-to-the-top costs \$50 and bragging rights are included! #### Ski or Golf

To ski or to golf, that is the choice. Why choose? Why not hit the slopes in the morning and tee off in the afternoon? At a dizzying base elevation of 8,260 feet, Reno's Mount Rose Ski Tahoe resort offers spring skiing just 25 minutes from downtown while sunshine warms the golf courses in the valley.

Skiers and snowboarders of all skill levels coast down the mountain ribboned with more than 60 trails. Expansive, gentle slopes encourage beginners, while the adrenaline-pumping, 200-plus acres of vertical Chutes dare experts. The resort's Rosebuds program offers a two-hour ski or snowboard group lesson for young travelers. Check out the resort's website at www.skirose.com.

Whether your tee shots sail down the fairway or dribble off the tee box, you're sure to enjoy a round of golf in Reno. How can you not, on courses framed by towering mountains, city skylines and an occasional coyote trotting by? Popular Wolf Run Golf Club challenges players over scenic desert terrain with plenty of elevation changes. Lakeridge Golf Course, a mature course lush with trees and greenery, belies its desert surroundings. As you tee off on its signature 15th hole. 140 feet above an island green, don't get distracted by the city skyline or you may just plunk your golf ball into Lake Stanley.

When you kick off your ski boots and head to the tee box, you may be interested in knowing that you spent the morning skiing down Slide Mountain. Curiously, the resort's namesake, Mount Rose, looms nearby and is known for its summit hike.

#### **Hike and Picnic**

Our hiking boots crunched and slipped on the pebbled, rocky surface. "A moonscape," I thought, as the wind whipped and the forest disappeared



behind us. Fixing our eyes on the steep trail, we trudged to the mountaintop. Looking up, I gasped. Reno sprawled below in miniature detail. Lake Tahoe reflected liquid blue and views stretched in endless panoramas. I felt like I was peering out an airplane window and, at an elevation of 10,776 feet, I could have been! That first trek to the Mount Rose summit led to many more and the views never dulled.

You don't need to hike to the top to enjoy the trail, but it's encouraging to know that the trailhead sits at the summit of Mount Rose Highway (state Route 431), at an elevation of 8,900 feet, so just parking your dinghy vehicle gets you partway up! The first couple of miles wend pleasantly to a seasonal waterfall that is a popular (and respectable) turnaround point. The greatest elevation gain (approximately 1,800 feet) occurs in the last 2 miles of the 5.2-mile ascent.

Tucked in the pines, well before the highway summit, lies Galena Creek Regional Park. Appearing simply as a local park, this hidden gem doubles as a gateway to the Mount Rose Wilderness. It's ideal for a picnic in the

woods, a youngster's fishing lesson at Marilyn's Pond (stocked with catchable rainbow trout) and a refreshing retreat from summer's rising temperatures. Beyond the picnic tables, forested paths and 0.4-mile interpretive trail, the wilderness beckons ardent hikers. mountain bikers and snowshoers to the popular Jones-Whites Creek Trail. This 9.2-mile loop delivers panoramic city views, creek crossings and overarching forests. A left turn at the trailhead sets you on a grueling 1.9-mile ascent, but the views are worth it. For a moderate start, turn right. The park is open year-round for day use and the visitor center (www. galenacreekvisitorcenter.org) is open seasonally from May through mid-October.

# **Ladders and Lakes**

Anglers, perched on stepladders in a lake, catch gigantic trout. It may sound like a fish tale but Pyramid Lake, 35 miles northeast of Reno, is home to the mighty Lahontan cutthroat trout, the largest of the cutthroat trout species. The world record-holder was fished out of the lake in 1925, earning its title at 39 inches in length and a whopping 41 pounds.

Famous for its unconventional "stepladder fishing," the lake lures anglers away from the shoreline

armed with kitchen ladders, 6-foot ladders and utility ladders. They wade into deeper water toward drop-offs where the fish swim to get into casting range. This ingenious method, pioneered in the 1970s, can be quite the spectacle on prime fishing days, as fisher-clad ladders stretch along the shallows. The Lahontan cutthroat trout season extends from October 1 through June 30, but experienced anglers tout March and April as the prime fishing months. Avid fishers cast lines from opening day right on through the winter. The lake is located on the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe's reservation, and the required tribal fishing permits can be purchased at the Sutcliffe Marina's Ranger Station or online at www.pyramidlake.us. For more information on the area's fishing, gear rental (including ladders) and quided fishing trips, visit Reno Fly Shop (www.renoflyshop.com).

# OREGON'S AWESOME CRATER LAKE

Translucent. Startling. Sapphire Blue.

eeing Crater Lake, the deepest lake in the United States, for the first time causes most people to sharply suck in their breath. Stand at any overlook and you'll hear phrases like "Oh my goodness." "It's so blue." "You can see through the water." "It looks like a jewel."

Dubbed the "gem of the Cascades," Oregon's Crater Lake is a geologic anomaly: an extraordinarily deep lake situated in a huge volcano filled with water that's eye-poppingly blue and incredibly pure because it's a closed system — no water comes in or out other than rain or snow that falls and evaporates. And for those who live in or are traveling through the Northwest, Crater Lake National Park makes the perfect RV getaway.

We head south on Interstate 5 around noon on a Friday under brilliant summer skies, an ideal start to our three-day adventure. It's about five hours from Oregon City to Crater Lake

and, just south of Salem, we leave the work-a-day traffic behind and cruise through the rolling hills and fields of wheat and sunflowers of the Willamette Valley. Just south of Albany, we're ready for a break from freeway driving and, on a whim, turn off on exit 216 at the sign for the Brownsville historic museum. Just a few miles down the quaintly named Over the Rivers and Through the Woods Scenic Byway, we come to the village of Brownsville, population nearly 1,700.

The Brownsville Historic Pioneer Museum (aka Linn County Historical Museum) focuses on relics from the pioneer migration on the Oregon Trail to the early 1930s. Too often, community museums are just collections of old stuff donated by area residents. The Brownsville museum features plenty of donated items, including the 1865 Drinkard covered wagon, one of only three remaining wagons known to have come over the Oregon Trail.

Museum coordinator Mandy Cole and her small volunteer staff also know how to tell a good story. They've created a miniature "town" complete



with blacksmith, dentist office, beauty parlor, post office and dry-goods store. They also have old musical instruments, neon signs, an unusual 1909 Brush two-person runabout car and an impressive collection of antique guns, including a flintlock musket and an 1878 Springfield rifle.

Historic Brownsville is intriguing, too, with period brick buildings and wooden storefronts that beg further exploration, but Crater Lake beckons so they'll have to wait for another day. Back on I-5, the land has become drier and hotter with oaks replacing fir on the hills and poison oak already turning red along the roadway.

# Along the Umpqua River

At Roseburg, we leave the freeway and, after a quick fuel stop, head east on state Route 138, a dotted highway on the map. This is the North Umpqua Highway and it soon becomes apparent why this road has been designated the Rogue-Umpqua Scenic Byway. Almost immediately we begin to climb into mountains dressed in thick forests of oak, madrone, pine and Douglas fir.

The two-lane road meanders along the North Umpqua River, a clear, shallow ribbon of green with occasional rapids and waterfalls. As we climb up and up, the forest thickens with more fir, cedars and maples shading the road, and the



# **Getting There**

Crater Lake National Park is located in southwest Oregon on state Route 62. From the south take U.S. Highway 97 to Route 62. From the north, follow state Route 138 to the park's North Entrance. The park's North Entrance is closed for about seven months each year, beginning November 1 (or earlier, if there is significant snowfall). When the North Entrance is closed, take Route 138 to state Route 230 to Route 62 and the park's West Entrance.

canyon becomes steep and narrow with impressive rock outcroppings. There are plenty of trailheads and forest campgrounds and, at 4,500 feet elevation, RV camping at Lemolo Lake.

Our ears are popping as we reach the summit (5,920 feet), pass Diamond Lake (another RV camping option) and sail through Crater Lake National Park's North Entrance. A seven-day pass to the park costs \$15, but we've got an America the Beautiful Senior Interagency Pass (a one-time \$10 fee), so we drive through at no cost. One of the best bargains going for older RVers, this lifetime pass also entitles us to half off camping in the park.

Visitors can take boat tours to Wizard Island. Guests at historic Crater Lake Lodge enjoy breathtaking lake views. A mom and her son capture memories of their Crater Lake visit.

Our first park view is Pumice Desert, a broad, flat plain covered with ash and pumice up to 200 feet deep from the explosion of Mount Mazama. After nearly 8,000 years, this desert is just starting to be invaded by scattered lodgepole pines.

# **First Views**

We climb to 7,270 feet and pull over at the first turnout overlooking the crater's rim. We're mesmerized by the sight — a 5-mile-wide expanse of bluer-than-blue water surrounded by soaring cliffs 2,000 feet high and a black dollop of volcanic rock called Wizard Island that's topped with a 700-foot cinder cone studded with trees. Across the indigo blue water, we spot the frothy wake of a single boat as it churns away from the island. While dozens of people stand with us, the only sound is the wind. All of us are rendered speechless by our first view of Crater Lake.

Scientists believe Crater Lake was formed 7,700 years ago when 400,000-year-old Mount Mazama, then 12,000 feet high, erupted in a series of massive explosions. The eruptions drained the mountain's giant magma chamber and the massive peak collapsed, leaving a 4,000-foot hole.





A short hike down easily navigated stone stairs takes visitors to Sinnott Memorial Overlook, where park rangers offer interpretive talks and displays. Trekking through Godfrey Glen under towering old-growth forests offers a cool and easy mile-long hike along Munson Creek.

Over time, the crater filled with water. As the water rose, the mountain blew out a few more eruptions, one that formed Wizard Island. Today, the lake holds 4.9 trillion gallons of water and is 1,943 feet deep in spots, so deep it causes all the colors of the spectrum except blue to be absorbed, giving the lake its distinctive color.

We drive toward Rim Village, stopping at some of the 30-plus turnouts to admire the ever-changing blue water as evening descends. We encounter two of the lake's residents: the golden-mantled squirrel and Clark's Nutcracker, a handsome gray and black bird about the size of a crow. The squirrels, which resemble



chipmunks, scamper fearlessly over, under and around the rocky scree, stopping occasionally to beg for a handout (don't feed them!). Clark's Nutcrackers, who possess the same bold personalities as blue jays, are the lake's gardeners, cracking open whitebark pine cones and planting thousands of seeds that eventually grow into trees.

Fatique pushes us to seek out Mazama Village Campground, one of two campgrounds within the park and the only one that accommodates RVs (214 sites: \$31/\$35 electric). Pull-through sites accommodate rigs as large as 50 feet, but many other RV sites are challenging to back into. While the online reservation system ensures a site, it doesn't actually assign one and both nights we encounter difficulty securing a campsite with power. Once we do, however, we set up and head out for a free ranger talk at the amphitheater. Tonight, it's "Pikas in Peril," about how climate change is impacting resident rodents; the next night it's "Denizens of the Dark" on nighttime animals in the park.

## Historic Lodge, Rim Tour

The following morning, we wake to radiantly clear skies and, on the road to Rim Village and Crater Lake Lodge, we can see all the way to Klamath Basin. We snug the motorhome into an RV parking spot in the upper parking lot. RVs aren't allowed in the lower lot near the lodge and by 11 a.m. this RV-designated lot quickly fills with cars that can't find a spot elsewhere. By noon, RVs and cars are double- and triple-parked, awaiting a spot.

We walk along the paved trail to Crater Lake Lodge, an impressive stone hotel and restaurant celebrating its 100th birthday. Originally built in 1913 in a slipshod manner, by the 1980s the old building was falling in on itself. The park service wanted to tear it down, but the public rebelled. So from 1989-1994, they built a new building within the original stone shell, retaining the old lodge's character while installing modern systems and upgrading seismic standards.

The dining room, all gray chiseled stone and massive tree trunks, offers impressive lake views. We grab a seat at one of the Mission-style tables and enjoy a sumptuous breakfast of stuffed biscuits and gravy.

There's a 33-mile drive around the lake's rim, and while we could drive it in the RV, we opt for a two-hour, narrated tour in a natural-gas-powered trolley. When we discover dusty, gravelly road construction, we're especially happy with our decision.

Originally opened in 1915, Crater Lake Lodge was renovated in 1994 and, while modernized, retains its historic character.

Trolley tours cost \$27 per person (\$24 for 60 and older) and stop at some of the most photographic views, including Phantom Ship, a craggy cinder-cone remnant that looks like a ghostly pirate vessel. Ranger Karlie tells us about the lake's geology and natural history, including fascinating facts like how the neon green staghorn lichen on the trees marks the yearly snow level.

After the tour, we check out Sinnott Memorial Overlook, a small rock parapet and indoor room built into the cliff with killer water views. There's a fascinating relief model of the lake and exhibits on the lake's geology and ongoing research.

## All Levels of Hikes

Whether you like to boat, bike, fish or hike, there's plenty to do. If you're



willing to navigate the dusty, steep Cleetwood Trail down to the water (700-foot elevation loss), the park offers boat tours (\$40) and you can fish for rainbow trout and kokanee salmon from shore (no limit, no license required, artificial lures only). Don't

forget to factor in the steep hike back up once your boat tour ends! The beautiful Rim Drive is also a favorite with bicyclists and motorcyclists.

Hiking is more our style, so after a late afternoon lunch in the motorhome we set out for a 2-mile hike along the caldera's western rim. The park offers more than a dozen hikes from easy half-milers to challenging 10-mile treks up steep terrain. Our trail along the rim is perfect — just enough up and down to get our hearts pumping, and there are plenty of spectacular views along the lake. By the time we head back to Mazama Campground, we're ready for another interesting ranger talk and a restful night under the trees.

Sunday is our last day in the park, but we want to get in a little more fun. After breakfast, we head to Steel Visitor Center at Park Headquarters to watch a 22-minute film about the park and to pick up a few souvenirs in the book/gift shop.

Then it's one last hike. We choose Godfrey Glen, a path that wends through old-growth forest and along steep and narrow Annie Creek Canyon. The trail follows Annie and Munson creeks, and there are several places where the waters have carved the volcanic ash and pumice into impressive pinnacles that look like giant, otherworldly soldiers standing guard over the landscape.

Tiny wild huckleberries can be found along the trail in Godfrey Glen. Their small size reflects the harsh environment and short growing season. Pumice Castle, eroded spires of pumice/lava along the east wall of the lake, stands 400 feet below the crater rim and is clearly visible from many turnouts along Rim Drive.

By the time we reach the motorhome, the weather has changed dramatically, a phenomenon not uncommon at these rarefied elevations. The temperature has plummeted and threatening clouds gather over the lake. While we've marveled at Crater Lake's majesty, it's definitely time to head home.

# NEWYORK'S FINGER LAKES

## Up close with waterfalls, wineries and the Amish

urprisingly, in the Finger Lakes region of upstate New York, bucolic farmland stretches as far as the eye can see and Amish horses and buggies clip-clop along the roads all day long. This area is ideal for a motorhome road trip, with easy, scenic drives and activities galore. Leisurely travel on the pretty roads offers not only a glimpse of America's bygone family-farm heritage but a chance to play and swim in the lakes, visit tall waterfalls and sample fine wine at dozens of upscale wineries.

On a recent RV trip through the area, my husband, Mark, and I were amazed by just how appealing the Finger Lakes

area is, and we loved the tranquility of the region. There are 11 lakes altogether, each one long and narrow and running north-south, like fingers, between the rolling hills.

Our first stop was in the town of Seneca Falls, which sits on the banks of a river connecting the north ends of Cayuga and Seneca lakes. The back side of this historic town may be its most beautiful side, as all the brick buildings back up to the river, and visiting boats tie up along the docks there. From our vantage point across the river, the boats and brick buildings made a striking image as they gleamed in the morning sun.

To our surprise, we learned that Seneca Falls was



the birthplace of feminism. Back in 1848, 300 people gathered in Seneca Falls for the "Woman's Rights Convention." They documented the current status of women in America, which was decidedly subordinate to men in every respect, and they called their document the "Declaration of Sentiments." Some 62 women and 38 men signed their names to it.


The Women's Rights National Historical Park in Seneca Falls, run by

the National Park Service, is dedicated to the evolution of women's rights since that first gathering, and there is a wonderful statue of Susan B. Anthony, Amelia Bloomer (who invented the namesake pantaloons of the time) and Elizabeth Cady Stanton overlooking the river. The three first met each other in that spot three years after the convention, in 1851, and together they ushered in the women's rights movement that eventually gave women



#### **Getting There**

the right to vote in 1920 via the 19th Amendment to the Constitution.

While Seneca Falls offers a peek at historical events of 165-plus years ago, the Amish people whose farms dot the landscape still live the way folks did in those times. The pretty town of Ovid is at a crossroads between Amish farming neighborhoods, and as we stood on the sidewalk in town, we were amazed to see one horse and buggy after another pass by.

Unlike other parts of America where Amish communities are on display for tourists like living museums, no one advertises the presence of the Amish in the Finger Lakes, and they go about their lives naturally without presenting a formal facade to the curious public. We spoke at length with an Amish 19-year-old about his open two-seater buggy,



a style of horse carriage used by unmarried men for courting. Showing us its steel tires and well-crafted drum brakes, and explaining the price differences between a fast horse and a slow one, the twinkle in his eye belied the freedom he felt at having his own set of wheels. His happy smile was not unlike the grin of a teenager holding the keys

to his first car.

Friends of ours who live in the area have befriended their Amish neighbors, and they took us to see the inner workings of an Amish family's dairy farm. We were surprised to find the cows hooked up to milking machines, and realized we had expected to see bearded Amish men sitting on milking stools!

We also visited an Amish chickenand-egg farm and were impressed by the large yard where 5,000 hens roamed outside. The farmer showed us the clipboard where he recorded detailed data on the egg production rates of his hens every day. Usually averaging 94 percent, he told us he'd been alarmed when egg production dipped to 80 percent after he'd inadvertently bought a bad batch of feed. Replacement feed quickly brought the production rates back up to normal.

The Amish are not allowed to use electricity because doing so would make them dependent on the community at large, which is the antithesis of their social goals. However, they do use propane to power their lights, and Amish homes are as well-lit at night as their non-Amish neighbors. We had a special and rare chance to show an Amish mother and daughter the inside of our RV. They loved our little home-on-wheels and nodded in recognition at the LP-gas-powered refrigerator!

Perhaps the highlight of our Amish immersion in the Finger Lakes was a

visit to the Seneca Produce Auction. Held in a huge modern warehousestyle building, this auction brought Amish produce sellers and both Amish and non-Amish buyers from far and wide. The Amish were all dressed in handmade royal blue and black outfits. The men wore straw hats encircled by a ribbon and the women wore white bonnets. An Amish auctioneer moved slowly from one crate of watermelon or corn or cantaloupe or tomatoes to the next, singing a rapid-fire patter of prices and quantities as buyers standing in a tight circle around him used hand signals to bid up the prices and make their purchases.

We stood at the back of the room, floored by the scene we were witnessing. Crates of produce that had been claimed were gradually taken out of the auction hall and loaded onto horse-drawn trailers and into the beds of pickups to be sold at farm stands and small grocery stores throughout the region.





The bucolic rural countryside is filled with natural beauty, including two fawns and a fox who paused for a picture. The towns and beaches of the area are fun to explore in an RV.

This auction gave us a real-life peek at how agricultural business and trade were conducted 100 years ago. Even more intriguing, though, was when we gazed at the landscape all around this part of the Finger Lakes and realized that the profusion of small farms owned by Amish families has given the world a way to see what much of the American countryside used to look like a century ago, before the rise of massive automated farm equipment and factory farms. Without the

Amish, those living images would likely be lost.

While the personal lifestyle choices of the Amish may seem quaint and a bit odd, the unintentional gift they have given this country by quietly retaining the farming lifestyle of our forefathers and keeping patches of the American landscape free of suburban homes and big-box stores is priceless. Interestingly, their numbers increase by almost 5 percent a year, and the Amish population as a whole doubled between 1991 and 2010.

The Amish don't drink or grow wine grapes, but the Finger Lakes is becoming increasingly known for its fine wine, especially white rieslings, and it seems there is a winery offering wine tours and tastings every half-mile or so on every road. For those who prefer a good microbrew beer, there are quite a few brewpubs too.

We stopped in at the Wagner Valley Brewery Co. in Lodi, and enjoyed a microbrew out on the huge shaded deck that overlooks Seneca Lake. This microbrew pub shares a gorgeous setting with the Wagner Vineyards Estate Winery (www.wagnervineyards. com). Deciding whether to learn about and sample wine or beer is simply a matter of choosing which door to enter!

As we savored a delicious dark beer, we watched a bevy of winsome young women enjoying a wild bachelorette party at the next picnic table on the deck. It turns out the New York Finger Lakes are a favorite spot for

Manhattan brides-to-be to take their friends on a day and night of winery or brewpub hopping, and these girls were whooping it up with glee on their second stop of what was to be a 10-stop winery tour.

Beginning about 150 years ago, New York City people built summer mansions along the Finger Lakes, and a few can still be found by the shores of Seneca Lake. These graceful old homes are girdled by wide shaded decks, and their grassy green lawns spill down toward the lake. Dense woods spread out behind them.

As we drove the backroads past these elegant mansions, we caught sight of two sweet little spotted







fawns and a fox. The trio was walking together through a meadow, and when they heard our vehicle they stopped and turned to have a look at us for a few precious minutes before wandering on. Mother Nature was giving us her best that day, and just a short way farther on we saw a doe and her pure white baby fawn. The Seneca white deer are not albinos but are sprinkled throughout the deer gene pool in the area. What a unique treat it was to see one!


Nature abounds in the New York Finger Lakes, and there are lots of stunning waterfalls. Taughannock Falls is enormously tall, plunging 215 feet straight down from top to bottom, and there is a great viewing area right across from it that offers a clear view of the whole waterfall. Ithaca Falls Natural Area is near the Cornell University campus and offers shady trails and a big area below the wide and expansive falls to wade in the water.


Another dramatic cascading waterfall is Hector Falls. The main part of the waterfall is on one side of the highway, but we scrambled down the rocks under the highway bridge to get a better view of the falls from below as the water slipped over stair-stepped slabs of stone beneath the bridge.

We bumped into Hector Falls while on our way to the granddaddy waterfall system of them all: stunning Watkins Glen State Park. We visited Watkins Glen on a gloomy, drizzly day, which turned out to be a fabulous time to visit because all the waterfalls were running at full force. We walked on the Gorge Trail through the canyon, following the carvings made in the rocks by Glen Creek. We climbed up and down stone staircases and crossed over the creek on handsomely crafted stone bridges.

Watkins Glen is home to waterfalls of all shapes and sizes, and each has its own personality. Cavern Cascade is tall and straight, and the trail scoots behind it, while Rainbow Falls is a thin veil of water that glitters like a spray of falling diamonds. We laughed as they sprinkled us when we dashed underneath. In between the waterfalls, the creek was serene and smooth, mirroring the surrounding cliffs on its surface.

We found a different kind of water play at the town of Hammondsport on Keuka Lake, where the community park at Champlin Beach provides an inviting spot for a swim. Sailboats lined the water's edge and the beach was hopping with sunbathers. The weather had turned hot and sultry,

and we happily joined the throngs of people jumping in the water for a refreshing dip.



# MOTORHOME MULTITASKING

## So, what else can I do with this thing?

he most common reasons people buy a motorhome are to travel the country, to go camping and to view nature in all its splendor. But when you're not out on the road, you have a very expensive vehicle sitting unused somewhere in a parking spot. But what if you didn't have to leave the motorhome stranded for weeks or months at a time? What if there were everyday uses for a motorhome that would make it less of a mobile vacation home and more of a utility vehicle? Think about your daily activities and ask yourself, "Could I be using the motorhome for this?"

I have a 37-foot Jayco Seneca Super C, so I need to pay close attention to the parking situations wherever I go. Always check on parking availability before heading out on your urban adventures.

#### Shopping

As a child, decades before I was even close to purchasing an RV, I often thought about how much better Christmas shopping would be if I only had a place to relax for awhile. My mother would take the family to the mall where everyone would be set free for the entire day to do their gift shopping. After an hour or so I was done (How much could a child really buy?), but the rest of the crew was still going strong. With an RV I could have gone to the parking

lot, kicked off my shoes and made lunch instead of sitting on those hard plastic mall chairs by the fountain or in a freezing car. I purchased my motorhome after my kids were older so I have never done a mall trip with my family. But when I am making modifications to the motorhome that I know will require several trips to the hardware store, I will occasionally drive it over and work on it in the store's parking lot, if it's OK with the store and if it's not too big of a project.

#### -Tailgating

When I bought my motorhome, one of the first things I wanted to do — apart from camping — was to tailgate at a Green Bay Packers game. I had been to Lambeau Field before in a car or van. and parking was easy. If the lots were full, we'd pull into someone's yard, as everyone with an open square of land was charging for parking. On our rookie season with the motorhome, we didn't have a plan for RV parking, and there wasn't a lot of information available online. We took our chances and set out for Lambeau the morning of the game. For a smaller, yet equally important sporting event, think locally. My two sons played lacrosse for several years from high school

Plus, having all of the equipment along to cook and serve lunch kept the team well-fed and ready to play.

I am a member of the Bike Haven Race Team in McHenry, Illinois. There are several races each season where nearly the entire team participates, and many of these races have dry camping available on-site. For the larger races I occasionally bring the motorhome as our team bus. Having a place to get dressed, to work on the bikes and to prepare a proper meal before — and enjoy a hot shower after — a race is extremely helpful. Recently, the team attended

#### Everyday Use

A large motorhome may not be the best vehicle for everyday use, but there are other ways to use your motorhome beyond the RV park. Before embarking on these types of adventures, make sure you are prepared. Will there be parking for a big rig? Are there any impediments along the way, such as low bridges or tight entrances? My rule is that if it's a place where buses normally take tour groups or trucks make frequent deliveries, you'll probably be fine. You can also purchase an RV GPS that details drivability along your intended routes. Call your destinations ahead to make sure parking is available, especially if you plan on staying overnight.

If you're going in the winter in a cold climate, make sure you have plenty of LP-gas, and that your plumbing system can handle the cold; otherwise, go dry. If you have a generator, that makes things even better since you will most likely have no power to connect to. Just make sure you have enough fuel, and the facility permits use of a generator.

Your motorhome is a recreational vehicle, so feel free to use it for all types of recreation. If you're doing something that requires extra time or driving, or even a large group of people, ask yourself if it would be more fun to take the motorhome. You'll find the answer is almost always in the affirmative.







Thor's 2017 Class C RUV features many creature comforts in a compact, nimble package

ompasses were developed by the Chinese 200 years prior to the Common Era and have been used for eons to indicate the direction one should travel. Thor Motorcoach developed its Compass — a Class C diesel Recreational Utility Vehicle (RUV) — for touring said direction in style and comfort. The company's new 23TB floorplan is both recreational and utilitarian, something of a multiuse tool among compact motorhomes; one that might easily meet the expectations of first-time RV adventurers, small families or veteran RVers considering a smaller unit.

The Compass lineup features three floorplans riding on the Ford Transit chassis (23TB, 23TR and 23TK) and one floorplan (24TX) on the Mercedes-Benz Sprinter chassis; all Compass motorhomes are less than 25 feet in length. The test motorhome — the 23TB — is powered by a 3.2-liter five-cylinder Power Stroke turbodiesel with 185 hp and 350 lb-ft of torque.

This is a 21st-century motorhome featuring amenities

such as USB ports at charging stations fore and aft. A large skylight brings natural illumination to the interior — wonderful for reading or hobbies — and spectacular views of the stars and moon at night. The intensity of light can be adjusted with an electric shade controlled by a switch mounted within easy reach of the driver or navigator, or from the living space. The natural light, combined with light-colored flooring, cabinetry and upholstery, makes the interior seem larger than measurements may indicate.

Compass designers found ways to incorporate three televisions into this floorplan. Think about that: Three TVs in a 23-foot motorhome mean you're never more than a few feet away from your own little flat-screen festival. TVs are mounted above the entry door, in the bedroom and in a weather-tight exterior compartment beneath the awning. The AM/FM radio and DVD player is just inside the door, mounted above a panel incorporating the slideout switch and indicators showing holding-tank levels and battery condition.

For safety and convenience, the entry steps are illuminated and a long, sturdy interior grab handle eases entry and exit. Switches at floor level control step lights, the patio light and a 14-foot Carefree lateral-arm awning. One touch of the awning-control switch extends the sheet, which appears to roll too far, then retracts and adjusts perfectly to display a strip of LEDs in the roller tube. Those lights cast a soft glow on the curbside of the motorhome.

Entering the interior, one steps onto light-colored residential vinyl flooring that extends from behind the cockpit through the bedroom and bathroom. The floor is easy to sweep clean with a hand brush and dustpan. Overhead is a hard vinyl ceiling that conceals ducts that distribute cooled and heated air from the rooftop air conditioner and heat pump.

The couch on the streetside wall sits beneath a large window. Covered with soft leatherette, the jackknife sofa easily converts to a bed. Seat belts at the couch will harness a pair of passengers but, as a bed, it will accommodate but one. While some couches can be uncomfortable without pillows to support one's back, this one is a perfect size for shorter folks, and very comfortable to boot. Its neutral color would be easily accessorized with a few bright pillows, if desired.

Serving as a dining table or workstation, a pedestal table mounts in front of the couch and swivels to ease access. On the road, the tabletop and A 32-inch LED TV is mounted above the entry door. Topped by LED strips, Euro-style cabinets span the kitchen counter, which includes a round sink and two-burner range.



post stow beneath the couch. Adjacent to the couch, behind the driver's seat, a charging station accommodates up to four devices corralled in a net sling. Two cup holders complete that panel; one residential AC electrical outlet is near the floor.

Above the couch, European-style cabinet doors pivot on soft-close hidden hinges and are accented with generous, easy-to-grasp handles. LED strips above the cabinet doors create indirect lighting at the ceiling. When more direct and more brilliant lighting are needed, flush-mounted ceiling and undercabinet fixtures are controlled by switches at the entry door, the bedroom and

beneath cabinets.

A 32-inch LED television hangs opposite the couch, above the entry door. On that curbside wall, another large window spans the length of the kitchen counter.

RVers who do the cooking will be impressed with the deep, round, stainless-steel sink. The tall, single-handle faucet allows one to easily rinse fruits and vegetables and clean the sink. A sink cover fits perfectly to make a flat countertop. Even with the cover in place, the gooseneck faucet with extendable sprayer is sufficiently tall to allow filling of tumblers or pans. To the right of the sink is a European-style, two-burner LP-gas cooktop with glass cover.

A cabinet convection microwave oven and drawer are beneath the counter. Location of the microwave at knee level made reading its electronic touchpad a bit of a challenge. Drawers throughout the motorhome roll on full-extension, ball-bearing quides.

Above the sink and window, another two-door cabinet is convenient to stow

dishes, glasses and coffee mugs. Each cabinet is divided with a recessed shelf that affords easy access to items of disparate height. An AC outlet is mounted in the underbelly of one cabinet, a safe and rather convenient spot. That said, one might have to boost the toaster or percolator to a height at which its AC cord will reach the outlet. The rack from the convection oven worked like a charm.

To the right of the cooktop, the two-door refrigerator easily handles perishables sufficient for about five days. Shelves in the door were the right size for our collection of condiments; small drawers held fresh produce. A bonus was the folding shelf to accommodate tall bottles, such as a two-liter bottle of soda. Freezer capacity was more than adequate for a like number of days. Two additional drawers are below the refrigerator.

Opposite the refrigerator is a pantry with adjustable shelves for dry goods. Two drawers below the pantry were perfect for flatware, cooking utensils and kitchen linens.

The bath is located at the curbside rear corner. The sink cabinet and medicine chest are nestled into the corner opposite the door and provide adequate storage for toiletries and first-aid supplies. The small, round

stainless-steel sink is reminiscent of those found on planes and trains. Brushing one's teeth takes some practice ... and good aim. The vanity beneath the sink has additional storage.

The commode is plastic with twoposition foot flush, allowing the addition of water for complete cleansing of the bowl. The shower stall is of more than adequate size, and the surround has corner shelves to hold tall containers of soap and shampoo. The skylight over the shower makes the bathroom bright. The floor of the shower was unnervingly flexible, a condition that might be resolved simply with additional support installed at the factory, as an owner would have a tough time accessing this area for a modification after the fact. A grab handle on the wall over the commode is convenient to assist getting into and out of the shower. While the bathroom is comparatively roomy, blow-drying one's hair is best accomplished after opening the door.

The bedroom area is an adventure in itself. The queen-size folding mattress can be opened only when the slide is fully extended, a distance of about 3½ feet.

Extended, the bedroom is spacious and comfortable. Windows flank the headboard, and lighting has been well-positioned for reading. Nightstand counters at each side will hold books and reading glasses; another USB charging station is at the front corner of the bed frame and AC outlets are accessible at each side of the headboard. A 32-inch LED television is




mounted at ceiling level on the wall at the foot of the bed.

Concerns regarding the level of comfort offered by a folding mattress were without foundation, so to speak. While shorter folks might need a running start to surmount the foot of the bed, once nestled in, campers will feel pleasantly at ease.

A closet beside the bed offers about 2 feet of hanging rod and has a deep drawer below. A curtain provides a modicum of privacy between the bedroom and living area; another privacy curtain mounts with hook-and-loop tabs up front, inside the windshield.

Retracting the bedroom slide involves folding the foot of the bed toward the ceiling, something akin to half a Murphy bed. Moving the slide out and leaving the bed folded uncovers a

padded seating area with three drawers and another mounting point for the pedestal table. Moving the table from the forward position to the rear creates a workspace suitable for a laptop and printer. The space is well-illuminated by natural light from the large rear window.

Getting on the road allows this little motorhome to shine. On the highway, the Compass is nimble and exhibits fine road manners. The five-cylinder Power Stroke diesel is responsive, which renders the 23TB more than adequate for city or interstate conditions. Circumnavigating Tampa, Florida, was a breeze, as the Compass easily kept pace with the flow of traffic.

One of our few complaints with this test motorhome was the amount of wind noise from the house entry door. Our resident technician determined that the condition could be corrected with adjustments to the door frame.

Cockpit ergonomics are friendly, with creature comforts such as open compartments of various sizes to hold sunglasses, extra keys, parking passes or tissues. Two cup holders are convenient to each seating position. The display on the AM/FM/CD stereo can be difficult to see in bright sun. The backup camera image is displayed in the rearview mirror. A generous, U-shaped overhead tray is a good spot for holding the Good Sam RV Travel & Savings Guide, road atlas, jackets and other items. Movement between the cockpit and living quarters is convenient since there is no center console. The

navigator seat swivels to add a seating position for socializing.

Design of the Transit van makes it easy for those inclined to service their own vehicle; dipsticks and fluid-reservoir caps are clearly marked and easily accessible. A sturdy step built into the front bumper puts even shorter folks at a height to reach into the engine compartment or clean the windshield. The fuel fill and reservoir for diesel exhaust fluid (DEF) are protected from tampering simply by closing the driver's door.

Baggage doors are well-gasketed to keep moisture and road dust out of compartments. The storage bays are wide and will easily accommodate folding chairs, patio carpet or small grills, but compartments are not particularly deep or high. Interiors are black, which can make it difficult to see what one is doing when connecting the sewer hose. for instance.

A large compartment beneath the kitchen window reveals the third — and optional — 32-inch LED television, which is mounted on a bracket that allows viewing from almost any angle.

Thor's Compass 23TB is a motorhome that will allow its owners to easily transit congested freeways, navigate city streets and breeze along country roads. Once positioned at an RV park, campground or other scenic spot, the Class C RUV offers creature comforts galore.

an 18-cubic-foot residential refrigerator, glass-tile backsplash behind the polished solid-surface countertops and deep double-bowl stainless-steel sink make meal prep easy — and clean. But things really pick up outside the Storm, where an exterior entertainment center teams up with a kitchenette outfitted with a small fridge, sink and microwave to make the area surrounding the campsite the star attraction.

#### Fleetwood Storm 36D

The two large streetside slides on the Fleetwood Storm 36D make for a free-flowing, open floorplan ideal for the small crowd that will no doubt descend upon your RV resort gatherings. 

## POWER PLAYERS

PRODUCTS DESIGNED TO PREVENT DAMAGE TO THE MOTORHOME CAUSED BY ELECTRICAL PROBLEMS

ost of our favorite RV parks have one thing in common: great location. They were built in the remote corners of our continent. For the rare older RV park that hasn't been upgraded, electrical anomalies can occur. Add to this the wear and tear from storms, maintenance work in the park and the sometimes quirky nature of the power grid in remote areas, and you have a recipe for some serious voltage and shock problems. Damage to your motorhome is likely from power surges and from over-voltage and under-voltage conditions. Other electrical issues, such as a hot-skin condition where electrical current is flowing through the body and chassis, can pose some real dangers to you and anyone touching your motorhome.

These conditions are why a dedicated segment of the RV aftermarket has devoted its energies to protecting motorhome owners from a variety of power-supply problems, with both hard-wired and portable surge protectors, and electrical management systems.

The problems that cause these conditions are numerous, and include "damaged wiring, damaged receptacles, miswired systems, insufficient grid capacity or plugging into [240 volts AC]," according

to Bobby Raatz, national sales manager for Southwire Co., a manufacturer of wire and cable used in the distribution and transmission of electricity.

Joe Casale of Progressive Industries said, "Surges and high voltage, low voltage, as well as some simple electrical conditions—open ground, open neutral and reverse polarity," add to the list.

These dangers are why these companies make products designed to handle a lot more than just power surges. The products come in two basic configurations — portable and hard-wired — with functions ranging from simple surge protection to sophisticated analysis and power cutoff for a wide variety of conditions. Some even make the process seamless with automatic reset on power restoration.

Portable units plug in at the

pedestal or power source and usually provide warnings about anomalies even before you plug your motorhome into the protective device. Portables have the advantage of not needing installation and can be used, or not, as you see fit. On the downside, they can be awkward to deploy and store. Portables are exposed to the elements and therefore may be targeted for theft so features should take these factors into account.

Hard-wired units are mounted permanently onboard your motorhome and are in operation each time you plug in. They are protected from weather and theft but they are not as easy to service or replace. Some hard-wired protectors include a digital display that can be wall-mounted inside your motorhome for easy monitoring.

Power-protection devices are not designed to be daisy chained or used in conjunction with other power-protection devices (including power-cord adapters). Most are offered in 50-amp or 30-amp models, so get the amperage level appropriate for your motorhome.

Watch for features that address various electrical

problems, including over or under voltage, open ground, open neutral, reverse polarity and accidental connection to a 240-volt AC power source. Also, note the distinction between "detection" and "protection." A device may have the capability to detect a power problem but not the capacity to protect (interrupt the power) while the problem exists. When a device does interrupt power, does it take manual input to resume or does it automatically resume connection when the power problem is resolved?

For portable devices, also look for features that make it easier to operate (auto reset and easy-pull handles) that protect from weather (seals, guards or covers) and that protect from theft (locking brackets and available accessories). All units that are designed to act as surge protectors will have a joule rating. A joule is a unit of energy, and for simplicity purposes, the higher the joule rating, the more energy the unit can absorb from a surge event. It is usually higher for 50-amp devices, because there are more conductors in the incoming cable, and the conductors are larger, thus allowing for a higher spike to occur.

#### Camco

Camco's Power Defender Voltage Protector helps protect a motorhome from damaging low- or high-voltage levels, power spikes and surges. The voltage protector (available in 30-amp and 50-amp versions) monitors incoming power and automatically disconnects when dangerous voltage levels are detected. It also automatically reconnects when levels stabilize between 102-132 volts AC. Camco's products include a reconnect delay to protect sensitive equipment from rapidly cycling power, and display faults for reverse polarity, open neutral and other power-pedestal wiring issues. MSRP: \$299 (30-amp); \$399 (50-amp).

The water-resistant unit incorporates integrated multilevel surge protection and diagnostic lights for visual indication of faults. Its integrated surge protection has a 2,450-joule power rating for 30 amps and a 3,850-joule power rating for 50 amps.

Camco's Power Defender Voltage Analyzer is a 30-amp circuit analyzer featuring diagnostic lights to indicate electrical wiring faults before you connect the electrical cord. The compact, weather-resistant unit also includes integrated surge protection. MSRP: \$69.

A basement-storage LED lighting upgrade makes finding your gear easier than ever

he storage bays in most Class A motorhomes are not only large but are also generally easy to access, which makes them great for storing large items that are not often used. On motorhomes with a raised-rail chassis, the storage bays in the middle of the coach usually pass all the way through, meaning you can access them from either side. The biggest problem we have noted with these basement storage areas is limited, if any, lighting. If you have ever had to dig something out of the basement at the RV park at night or, even worse, while parked alongside the road in the dark, you know how frustrating it can be. Often we resort to holding a flashlight in one hand as we push items aside while trying to retrieve the item we actually wanted. Newer motorhomes can come equipped with standard or optional lighting packages inside or outside, but few have what we consider a fully functional lighting package that makes the basement storage areas completely usable in daytime or nighttime conditions.

[1] Shown here is the incandescent light fixture that came installed in this motorhome. Not only is it dim, it doesn't provide consistent lighting throughout each storage bay. [2] After removing the lens cover we unscrewed the light fixture from the wall of the storage bay.





After years of suffering with a few poorly placed incandescent wallmounted lights in the basement of our motorhome, we decided it was time to finally fix the problem. Our upgrade goals were not only to have more total lumens in each basement cargo bay, but to also have more usable lighting that was spread out evenly throughout the bay. In this motorhome, the storage bay that contains the house and chassis batteries didn't have any lighting at all. The lack of lighting above the batteries made checking the electrolyte level particularly difficult, so we wanted to install a light and switch in there as well.

When determining what type of lights to use for our upgrade, we

looked at many types of fixtures and bulb types and our search pointed toward high-intensity LED lights. Not only are LED lights long-lasting, they also have very low current requirements, making them ideal for use in a typical 12-volt DC environment such as a motorhome. Another big advantage is that LED lights are available in long strips. In basement storage areas that are both wide and deep, it is important to light the entire area. Long strips of high-intensity LED lights are perfect for this application because they can be applied to the ceiling of the entire storage bay, which ensures consistent light throughout the bay.

When searching for LED lighting, be careful before you make a purchase because there are a lot of low-quality products on the market. After reading many reviews and looking at the various offerings on the market, we selected Boogey Lights (www.boogeylights.com). Unlike other brands on the market, Boogey Lights products are considered professional-grade, which relates to durability and longevity. Our basement-lighting package is a simple one-color setup with both LED strips and a few "pod" lights, but if you

[5] We then reconnected the light housing to the wall using the original screws. [6] Before mounting the LED light strip we tested it to ensure it functioned properly. As you can see, the light output is significantly improved when compared to the original light.

[3] Make sure there is no power to the lights before cutting or working with the wiring, then use a wire cutter to cut both of the wires leading to the lightbulb assembly. [4] Next, we took the power lead for the new LED light and wired it to the black wire in the toggle switch from the light fixture. The ground wire from the LED light strip was then connected to the ground lead from the coach. We elected to solder the connections and then cover them with shrink tubing. If you prefer, you can use crimp-type terminals and avoid soldering. Just make sure there is a solid connection or the wire can come loose.



want something more elaborate the company offers interior and exterior multicolor lights that can be controlled via remote or even Bluetooth using a smartphone.

Another huge advantage of dealing with a professional company like Boogey Lights is experience. No matter which lights you choose, if you don't get the correct products and techniques to install them properly they will fall off in a short time and you will be very unhappy. Boogey Lights sells the lights and also uses professional-quality installation products such as 3M-brand doublesided tape and 3M adhesion primer, as well as cable ties and mounts that are absolutely critical for a long-lasting and professional-looking installation.

Of course every installation is different but this article illustrates

[7] After cleaning the overhead area with alcohol, we used the supplied 3M-brand primer to ensure the 3M double-sided tape will make a permanent bond. Make sure to attach the tape on a smooth, flat area or else you run the risk of adhesion problems. In some areas you may elect to attach the light strip with cable ties, if that suits your application better. [8] Shown here is a segment of the LED light strip attached to the ceiling of the basement. After proper cleaning and priming, the adhesion of the system seems to be very strong. Don't take shortcuts with the installation — if you do, the lights may not adhere properly. [9] In order to make a professional-looking installation, we used these cable-tie mounts to hold the wires in place. Make sure to use the 3M primer and alcohol when installing these as well. Repeat this same installation process for each bay until you have all the old lights out and all the new LED lights installed and mounted. [10] Each storage bay is different, and of course, every coach is different, so you may have to be creative when looking for a good place to mount the lights. In this bay we attached the LED light to the steel tubing directly over the door. This location keeps the lights from being bumped with cargo and puts the light directly into the basement instead of into your eyes.

how we installed the LED lights in our motorhome. Since most of the storage bays in this motorhome already had a surface-mounted light that included an integrated on/off switch, we decided to use it as opposed to removing it and starting over. The light was already screwed to the wall of the bay and it had 12-volt DC wiring from the fuse box, so removing it would have left

holes in the wall. Therefore, we decide it was easier to leave the light mounted where it was and simply remove the existing 12-volt DC incandescent bulb and holder from the light fixture and then wire the new LED lights into the existing switch. This method prevented the unsightly holes in the wall and eliminated the need to buy and install an on/off switch in each bay. In the

section that didn't have a light or a switch we used a surface-mount push-button switch from Boogey Lights and mounted it to a hard surface on the wall.

When deciding what lights we needed for our project we first measured each bay and determined how long each light segment should be, and also measured to determine how long the power lead needed to be. Then we ordered each light custom-made to a length. In the battery bay we decided to use LED pods instead of a light strip. Overall the pods don't put out quite as much light as longer strips, so we used two of them directly over the battery bank.

[15] After installing the LED lights, seeing the contents of the storage bays and accessing them at night is now an easy task. The light is so white and bright compared to the tired old incandescent lights that were there originally. Plus, the modular system allows you to install the lights exactly where you need them the most.

[11] In some cases, you may want to daisy chain lights together as shown here. When we placed our order with Boogey Lights we had power leads installed on each end of some lights to allow this to be done. If you decide that you don't need the extra lead, it can be cut off and not affect the function of the light. [12] In the battery bay we had to install a switch and light since none were present originally. We used a surface-mount on/off switch from Boogey Lights and attached it to the wall using the 3M tape. Now we can easily check the battery levels even at night. [13, 14] Here is a side-by-side photo taken at dusk with the exact same settings on the camera so you can see the drastic difference in lighting that is provided by the Boogey Lights high-intensity LED lights.

## DIY DREAM RIDE

## LEFT FOR DEAD AFTER A DAMAGING REFRIGERATOR FIRE, A SALVAGED 2003 COACHMEN CROSS COUNTRY ELITE HAS BEEN RESURRECTED TO CUSTOM-COACH MAIESTY

ichelangelo once said that every block of stone has a statue inside it, and it is the task of the sculptor to discover it. That is a quote that Lamar Johnson likes to use to explain the potential he saw when he got his first look at the 2003 Coachmen Cross Country Elite 37.5 that would become his own work of art. It is an opinion not initially shared by his wife, Winda.

"She took one look at it and said, 'You're crazy!'" he admits.

The motorhome had all of the prerequisites on Lamar's list: a 300-hp Cummins diesel, two slides, hydraulic levelers, a washer/dryer, a split bath and a front entry door. Unfortunately, it also had serious damage from a refrigerator fire, leaving a gaping hole in the side wall and roof. The interior walls, carpet and upholstery were all burned or blackened by smoke. Everything would need to be gutted and replaced. The scope of the renovation

was so massive that the couple who had purchased it at auction had given up before they had even begun. Yet none of this phased Lamar.

"From the beginning, I was envisioning what it could look like. I wasn't intimidated," he says. "The chassis was intact, and the diesel engine was in good working condition. I just looked at everything else and thought, 'OK, all this can go."

The price for the salvaged coach was \$7,500, exactly what Lamar and his wife had gotten from the sale of their old gas-powered Coachmen Chaparral fifth-wheel. And perhaps it was no coincidence that they found this Coachmen in Phoenix, Arizona, a city named for the mythical bird that rises from the ashes to be reborn. In the end, Winda agreed, and they took their "project RV" back home to California.

Lamar's first concern was repairing the roof and side wall. He got a quote of \$8,000 for a new roof,

but after doing some research and watching videos on the internet, he decided it was a job he could tackle with a little help. He needed to replace some of the roof's aluminum frame as well as an overhead interior ceiling truss, and fortunately a friend knew a welder who agreed to do the job after hours — for a mere \$40. The remainder of the repair he did himself, at a total cost of \$1,200 for materials.

Once the motorhome was sealed from the weather, the interior renovation began. Lamar contacted Coachmen, and the reps were extremely supportive, sending him the electrical schematics as well as detailed information on the motorhome's layout. He gutted the rig from outside the rear bedroom door, where all the fire damage occurred, to the front windshield and began the task of rebuilding. In the process, he replaced wallboard, ran new 12-volt DC wiring, added a new rooftop air conditioner and laid a porcelain tile floor. He found that the cabinets were all still structurally sound, so they were stripped and stained. Once cleaned, the Corian countertop was also still in good condition, but most of the appliances had to be replaced. He chose an apartment-sized residential refrigerator and a convection microwave, and kept the original four-burner LP-gas cooktop. He finished off the new, modern kitchen with undercabinet LED lighting and an attractive tile backsplash.

All of the furniture in the main living area was replaced, and both the driver and passenger seats were reupholstered, one of the few jobs Lamar did not do himself. He also added a 52-inch rear-projection TV, a 32-inch flat-screen TV, a new stereo/ DVD player, additional speakers for surround sound and several new reading lights. The bathroom also received a makeover, with new tile and a tempered-glass shower door to give the space an open, roomier feel.

The end result? An interior that rivals any new coach — and it only took six months.

"I got a lot of help from friends, and my wife was very supportive," Lamar says. "She would bring out lunch, and diesel fuel to keep the generator running, so we could continue to work inside the RV when the temperature was over 100 degrees."

Winda would also encourage him to "hurry up and finish our future penthouse" because she couldn't wait to travel, an attitude that Lamar says was "a great motivator." He also credits the RV community for its support.

"Whenever I needed guidance, I found it there," he says.

He was equally impressed by his motorhome's manufacturers. In addition to getting help from Coachmen, he also contacted Freightliner, makers of his chassis. to get engine specs, information about the hydraulics and information on finding replacement parts. There was a small leak in the plastic coolant reservoir, and they helped him find a new reservoir, along with the engine-coolant sensor. He praises both companies for their dedicated









A refrigerator fire caused extensive damage to the motorhome, both inside and out. Johnson began by repairing the roof and frame, and then worked his way to the interior. Inside, restoration included laying a new wood-look tile floor, repairing and painting walls and replacing the furnishings. Fortunately, Johnson found most of the cabinetry to be structurally sound, so it only required refinishing.

customer service, which made his own job much easier.

Lamar estimates that he has about \$23,000 invested in his Coachmen at this point. He still plans to have the entire exterior professionally painted sometime in the future. He would also like to add a Banks PowerPack System to the Cummins engine to boost power and to compensate for the added weight of the new flooring. Still, he is satisfied with his results thus far. He and his wife, and 10-yearold daughter, Keysa, spend vacations and holidays at their site in the Mountain Lakes Resort in Lytle Creek, California, or traveling to the beach,

and they all feel like the motorohome is part of the family.

'This was a route I could explore without going into financial debt. I knew what I wanted — a diesel engine, two slideouts, hydraulic levelers, even the layout — and I knew the price of a diesel coach. The best thing about this RV after the renovations is that I have no payments, and everything works just the way the factory designed it, only with my vision."


Buying a salvaged motorhome is certainly not for everyone, a fact Lamar freely admits. In most states, including California, any damaged vehicle with repair costs that will

#### TO SALVAGE, OR NOT TO SALVAGE?

Salvaged motorhomes are not an option unless you are a skilled DIYer. Even then, you need to carefully weigh the costs versus benefits. Many insurance companies will provide only liability coverage for coaches with a revived/rebuilt title, so all of that hard work could potentially go up in smoke. If you ever plan to sell, dealers often will not accept these RVs as trade-ins, and potential buyers may be scared off by the branded title. On the plus side, salvaged motorhomes are cheap and do give you the opportunity to upgrade affordably, something you might not be able to finance if you pay the price for the same older motorhome with a clean title. For example, a 2003 Coachmen Cross Country

Elite title sells for anywhere from \$52,000 to \$85,000 on the used market, and it is likely that the carpet, appliances and upholstery would still need updating. This makes the Johnsons' \$23,000 investment a

good deal, particularly since they have no intention of selling their motorhome. The bottom line: Salvaged vehicles are a gamble, but in some situations, that gamble can pay off, so caveat emptor -

exceed 75 percent of its value can be declared a total loss by the insurance company. Given depreciation and the exponentially higher costs of rebuilding an RV versus a car or truck, older motorhomes that have sustained damage have a greater likelihood of being branded a "salvage" title. This doesn't mean they can't be brought back to life, but it does present a series of hurdles — and some long-term problems — for prospective owners.

In California, a salvaged vehicle can be rebranded as "revived" (some states term this as "rebuilt") if the owner follows certain requirements. To re-register a salvage vehicle, the owner must have bills of sale for all the major and minor parts used in the reconstruction of the vehicle, and an application for registration along with a vehicle construction statement will need to be given to the DMV. Revived salvage vehicles are also required to be inspected by the DMV or the California Highway Patrol (CHP) before DMV can issue title and registration. Even if the vehicle has been restored to pristine condition, it will always have a branded title, affecting potential resale value and insurance coverage.

None of that dissuaded Lamar. As he points out, he did not rebuild his Coachmen to sell it; he intends to use it. He expects that this motorhome will carry him and his family through the decades until retirement and beyond,

at a fraction of the cost of even a used diesel-powered motorhome with the same amenities.

"Besides, would Michelangelo ever part from his David?" he asks only half-jokingly because this motorhome really is his masterpiece.

As happy as he is with the product of his labor, Lamar has some cautionary advice for anyone considering a project of this magnitude. First, make sure you know what you want in a coach, since this is a job you only want to do once. Once you find your diamond in the rough, do your research to know what it will take to complete the job (building materials, special tools and skills like welding, plumbing, electrical or mechanical expertise). Then ask yourself, do you have the time, spousal/family support and patience for the project? Be honest with yourself; when you look back at your projects in the past, are you a finisher, or do you have a tendency to leave jobs incomplete?

"If you think you can, you can," says Johnson firmly. "If you think you can't, you won't."

One look at the Johnsons' 2003 Cross Country Elite is proof of just what positive thinking and elbow grease can accomplish. Revived by one man's dream, this motorhome ascended like a phoenix from the ashes, rising to take its place as a true classic ride. We've got you covered where insurance leaves off.


### QUICK TIPS | HOT LINE | COACH & POWERTRAIN

#### **Counter Productive**

The kitchen counterspace in our Class B motorhome is a bit small. I went to a local kitchen counter remodeler and bought a scrap of counter that was cut out for a sink. The 20-by-20-inch piece increased our counter by 400 square inches.

The add-on is held in place by a piece of angle aluminum, painted black, and held to the window frame with silicone adhesive. There is a 1-inch spacer leg at the corner that rests on the original counter next to the stove; this is also glued on with silicone.

#### Screen-Door Handle

The standard screen-door latch on an RV is a fragile plastic assembly, which doesn't hold up well when constantly used to pull the door open. I've had to replace mine a couple times, and came up with a way to take the strain off the assembly.

Cut a 4-inch length of  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch-by- $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch aluminum angle. Drill a hole near each end, mating holes in the lower section of the door's slide panel behind the release lever. Fasten with stainless-steel screws and nuts.

Now just press the release lever with your thumb or palm while pulling on the new handle with your fingers — no more strain on the latch assembly! It may not prevent the latch from breaking, but it will take the pressure off the latch. It's worked well for me.

#### Put On the Squeeze

Filling the coach and starting batteries is often a difficult task, and one that can be hazardous, but I found a way to simplify this messy job by repurposing a plastic bottle. A stand-on-its-head ketchup bottle and a piece of ¼-inch plastic tubing make an excellent battery water filler. Remove the bottle's labels, open the outer cover, drill a hole through the center of the threaded cover and insert a ¼-inch plastic tube (approximately 24 inches in length) into the bottle to reach the bottom. (Drill the hole about a millimeter smaller than the tube for a tight fit.) To use, fill the bottle with distilled water, insert the open end of the tube into the battery and gently squeeze the bottle. Caution: Wear eye protection and do not overfill the battery cells. A permanent marker can be used to label the bottle as desired.

## Crack Down

Upset that their costly refrigerator developed a crack only a few months after its 1-year warranty had expired, a couple turned to Hot Line for assistance. They wrote:

We are writing to Hot Line hoping you can help us with a crack that appeared at the bottom interior of our four-door Norcold refrigerator. We purchased the refrigerator new on February 5, 2015, and paid \$3,602.38, which included a \$150 shipping charge. The refrigerator was shipped to River City RV in Grants Pass, Oregon, where we were in the process of purchasing our 2006 Fleetwood Pace Arrow. It was then installed on the motorhome, replacing the refrigerator that was in the rig. Upon receipt from the shipper and after installation, we carefully inspected the refrigerator for defects, inside and out, and did not find any. The 1-year warranty that came with the refrigerator expired in February 2016. We did not have any issues with the new refrigerator until September 2016.

On September 22, 2016, while on an RV trip to Brookings, Oregon, I opened the refrigerator door and discovered a crack, measuring approximately 4 inches, at the bottom of the interior of the refrigerator. The crack began on the right side of the plate located on the bottom center interior of the refrigerator and traveled back toward the right side crisper drawer.

I am certain that the crack was not present prior to our trip, and that nothing was dropped from an upper shelf in the refrigerator. The crack just "appeared" on that morning when I first opened the refrigerator door.

I contacted customer service at Thetford Corp./Norcold Inc. regarding this on October 7, 2016, and spoke to Myka Herron about the issue. Herron asked me to send her photos of the crack, which I did, along with an email. Herron sent me a reply email on October 17 that read. "This crack has come from the screw on the right-hand side being too tight. Unfortunately, you are out of your 1-year warranty with us, and we will not be able to cover this issue. However, this crack will not affect cooling of the refer. A suggestion would be to drill a tiny hole into the crack where it starts, and apply a silicone caulk to seal up the crack."

I responded to her email stating that "I can't believe that this \$3,600 refrigerator only comes with a 1-year warranty, especially since this appears to be a manufacturing defect. Can we get the crack in the refrigerator repaired in the manner you suggested, free of charge, at our nearest authorized Thetford repair dealer?"

A week later, I received a response from Herron that stated, "I have spoken to my superior and he has informed me that we would not be able to cover any labor costs on your unit seeing that it is out of warranty and there was not any record of an issue with your refrigerator while you were within your warranty period."

We would like our refrigerator either repaired by an authorized Thetford/Norcold dealer in our area, or replaced. A \$3,600 refrigerator should not get a crack in the interior when it has been properly cared for and is only 19 months old. We are not full-timers, so the refrigerator isn't in constant use. A refrigerator is not something you expect to have to replace less than 24 months after purchase.

Although the refrigerator was indeed out of warranty, we passed along the Ellsworths' request to see if Thetford/ Norcold might reconsider. A few months later, we received a copy of the company's letter to the Ellsworths, which filled us in on the resolution of their case. It read:

Thank you for bringing to our attention the concern regarding the lining crack in your Norcold refrigerator. Hopefully the repair performed by our field technician meets with your approval. Please let us know if you experience any further issues.

As a token of our appreciation for being a loyal Norcold customer, enclosed please find a bottle of cleaning solution.

## Speedometer and Tach Fluctuations

I have a 1998 Tradewinds diesel motorhome that I purchased new. On a recent trip from Minnesota to Arizona, the speedometer and tachometer would fluctuate while driving between 60 and 75 MPH, while I was holding the accel-

between 60 and 75 MPH, while I was holding the accelerator steady. When I would engage the cruise control, the speedometer would still fluctuate between 60 and 75 MPH, while my speed appeared to remain steady. After stopping for lunch or at night, it would be OK for awhile, but then start fluctuating again. Do you think this might be the instrument panel, a bad sender, a poor connection or ground, or a diode?

The fact that both gauges fluctuate together and at a steady speed indicate that the problem is not in the vehicle speed sensor or tachometer engine speed signal. Also, if the vehicle speed sensor signal was fluctuating,



the cruise control would have problems maintaining a constant speed. So, yes, the problem likely lies in the dash cluster area. First, check the ground connection. Try running a new temporary independent wire with alligator clips, connected to a clean solid ground or directly to the battery ground post. The matching variations of the two gauges indicates a voltage fluctuation. If a good ground doesn't clear up the problem (although I suspect it will), measure the voltage at the gauges with a digital voltmeter while the motorhome is driven at the speeds you mentioned. This motorhome is on a Freightliner chassis, so besides taking it to an RV shop for help, you can also take it to a Freightliner dealer.

#### Steps Not Working Correctly

I have an LCI retractable step on my 2011 Monaco Monarch motorhome. When I either retract or extend the steps, they will reach the full extension and the motor will continue to run, making a banging noise. It seems like there should be a limit switch to tell the motor to stop running. I called Lippert, and they said I should replace the complete motor system for \$125. The motor works OK, it doesn't know when to stop.

Unfortunately, the limit switch that tells the motor when to stop is part of the motor assembly, and so it's all replaced as an assembly. The banging noise is probably stripped gears from the motor-drive assembly, which further reinforces the need to replace the whole unit. You might be able to find a lower price online somewhere, but

Lippert was right about the need to replace the motor assembly.

#### **Dead Outlets**

We have a 2010 Rexall 35-foot motorhome. The electrical outlets don't work. I checked all the outlets and they all look good. The kitchen area and bathroom outlets work. Could the converter be the problem? Do you know where the converter is located?

The converter does not power the 120-volt AC outlets; it only produces 12 volts DC for low-voltage appliances, accessories and lights and battery charging, so this is not the culprit. First, check for a tripped circuit breaker in the onboard power-distribution panel. It's also possible that there is a bad breaker in the panel. Ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) outlets are typically used for the

kitchen and outside the motorhome, but it's possible that the nonworking outlets were wired into this circuit instead of those required by code. Find the GFCI outlet and make sure it's not tripped; reset if need be by pushing the appropriate button. If you have a higher-end coach, you may have an inverter/charger system instead of the converter. If this is the case, the inverter (Magnum, Xantrex, Go Power, etc.) may have a circuit breaker on it that could be tripped, so checking that is high on the list. If all the above pan out, then you could be looking at a wiring or receptacle issue. Sorting this requires a digital multimeter, and tracing the wiring from the circuit breaker using voltage, to each receptacle in that circuit. A wiring diagram would be helpful in this case. It's not unusual for one receptacle in a daisy chain of receptacles to have a bad connection internally. This is best handled by a certified RV technician.

#### **Shifting Advice**

We have a 2003 Ford E-450 chassis with the V-10 engine in our 2004 Winnebago Minnie Winnie (31 feet) Class C. I'm especially concerned about manually downshifting on an upgrade, and what is a safe speed mechanically so as to not over-rev the engine on a long upgrade. Should I just put my foot to the floor and let the engine and transmission do whatever? We have no tachometer.

The engine's electronic controls have a built-in limiter which should prevent you from over-revving the engine at full throttle going up a grade. The automatic transmission also is designed to prevent overrevving even if a driver selects a gear that's too low for the vehicle speed while descending a grade. Additionally, it will automatically force an upshift if the vehicle gains too much speed while in a manually selected lower gear to the point where the engine could exceed its redline.

You can determine for yourself what these speeds are in your specific motorhome. Simply accelerate at full throttle from a stop at the bottom of a long grade, with the shift selector in top drive gear. When it upshifts first, second and third gears, note the indicated speed and have your passenger write these down. These are your maximum shift points (which are at around 5,000 RPM). For a long engine and transmission life and fuel-economy reasons, I suggest you stay considerably below these points (about 20 percent) whenever possible. If you are concerned with the lack of a tachometer, you could add an aftermarket gauge, which is readily available and not too expensive.

#### Tire Heat Damage


I recently purchased a 2003 Monaco Signature Series motorhome. I immediately replaced the tires because the old ones were about 13 years old. I had not yet sold my previous motorhome and it was parked about 18 feet from the Monaco. Unfortunately, the older motorhome caught fire one night (fire originated in the engine compartment), and the coach was totaled. The Monaco was also damaged by the heat. On the side nearest the fire the paint blistered, and plastic access doors and panels melted and warped. There was no visible damage to the new tires, but I would like to know if that much heat on the tires would have compromised the integrity and safety of the tires. I have tried to find information on the internet, but so far have only come across information about the ill effects of extreme road heat on tires.

This is indeed a rare situation, as usually when a fire destroys a motorhome, the tires go with it. I would have a discussion with the insurance adjuster, who should have experience with all types of damage caused by a fire. This should be done in a timely manner. If there was any visible damage such as blistering, it goes without saying to replace the ones showing damage. However, in this case, I suggest taking it to a respected tire dealer franchise of the brand involved for inspection. If you feel that the person doing the inspection is not an expert, don't be afraid to get a second opinion at another shop.

#### Air-Brake Conversion?

We have a 2007 Holiday Rambler Vacationer 34PBD. This is a diesel pusher with a Cummins ISB-AD 300HP. It has an RSR Rail Chassis (beefed-up Workhorse) with leaf-spring suspension and hydraulic anti-lock braking system. My question is in reference to the braking system. It is very, very difficult to stop this unit. Is it possible to improve the hydraulic unit? If not, is it possible to have an air system installed and add air brakes? I know this will be a costly endeavor, but it will be cheaper

than buying another motorhome. I will appreciate any information you can provide. I have taken the unit to a truck/ trailer brake shop and had the brakes inspected. The mechanic said the "System is working correctly and the pads are good; it is just hard to stop."

Converting to air brakes is out of the question; for liability reasons, it would require hiring an engineer to design a system and an expert brake specialist to install it — and it would have to be certified. Total cost might easily exceed the cost of the coach. You didn't say how many miles are on it, but motorhomes with hydraulic brakes generally need some brake service every three to four years. The pads could be hardened and glazed, and the rotors could be glazed. This would require more pedal pressure to stop.

I believe this model has Bosch brake calipers that were in the same family that the Workhorse chassis had issues and a subsequent recall with. The chassis could have sticky brake pistons, glazed pads and rotors and old brake fluid. Any or all of these items could cause brakes to underperform, but still appear to look normal. Brake fluid absorbs moisture from the atmosphere, causing the fluid to lower its boiling point, and therefore should be flushed and replaced every few years. Also, towing a car without a good auxiliary braking system could have contributed to the motorhome's glazed brakes.

I suggest you have a brake specialist go through the system and make sure the caliper pistons are not sticking, that no parts are under recall, and consider resurfacing the rotors (or replacing if needed) and installing premium brake pads at all corners. Flush, replace and bleed the brakes, and test the brake booster performance. Always break in new brakes carefully to prevent hard stops early on, which glaze linings.

#### Flat Towing an HHR

I have a 2009 Chevrolet HHR that I tow flat with my 2001

Dutch Star. I have only towed it a couple of times. The owner's manual instructs to pull the No. 8 fuse (the ignition pass key switch). But when I do this and turn the ignition switch to unlock the steering wheel, the instrument panel lights up. I assume that if the ignition fuse is pulled the instrument panel would not light up. Am I missing something here? Also, due to the number of times this process is going to take place, I don't want to wear out the hook-and-loop material holding the fuse panel on. Can you recommend a better process for keeping the battery charged? On my 2009 Jeep Wrangler I mounted a battery disconnect to the negative cable under the hood and that works fine. I realize the battery in the HHR is located in the back of the car and that I would have to run a long cable to the front but I could make that work. Tom Ranly | Benson, Arizona

Disconnecting the battery to prevent its discharge also wipes out radio station presets and some other functions in the computer memory. Depending on the vehicle, these may also include power seat and mirror settings, and in some cases the radio may need a code input. Instead of doing this, I suggest you run a charge line from the motorhome to the HHR's battery. It must have circuit breaker protection at each end in case of a short circuit. Several companies offer kits, including RV Power Supply (Toad Charge, 888-447-4552) and Roadmaster (800-669-9690).

#### **KING Satellite Antenna Issue**

I have a 23-foot Thor Chateau Class C motorhome. On the roof is a KING Tailgater satellite television antenna. Once the TV and satellite receiver are turned off, the antenna continues to search for a signal. I know the antenna is powered by the receiver, but is my problem normal? It's very annoying at night when we are trying to sleep.

I spoke with a KING technician, and he told me that what is likely happening is that your unit is trying to receive software updates by satellite, even when your receiver is off. So, as long as power is applied to the receiver, it will continue searching to try to make the connection. The solution to this is to unplug the receiver from the wall outlet, which will kill the whole system. KING has a customer service number (952-922-6889) which owners can contact for technical questions.

#### Towing a Jeep Scrambler

We have a 1985 Jeep Scrambler that we would like to flat tow. From what I can find on the internet. the advice for doing so runs from "Not a problem!" to "BIG problem." Apparently Jeeps can be ordered with different transfer cases, and the Scrambler came with one that is often designated as not compatible with flat towing. The local Jeep aftermarket shop said "No problem," but I remain unconvinced.



Novak is a leading authority on the subject. So, your Jeep is towable and the procedure for towing is to ensure that the front hubs are unlocked, the transfer case is in Neutral (N) and the transmission is in gear (to keep it from spinning at all). Use high gear on manual gearboxes, Park on automatics. Make sure to flush the old gear oil and refill with fresh 80W-90, API-GL5 or MT-1 rated fluid.

#### Genset Quits — Comment

My letter is regarding "Genset Quits" letter in the January 2017 issue. We had a somewhat similar problem with the propane-fueled generator in our 2016 Winnebago View.

The generator would start and run, but it would eventually quit while under load. The Cummins Onan service center near Springfield, Oregon, agreed to help without an appointment. The service writer and a technician performed a diagnostic series and determined the problem was with the propane controller. A new controller was installed and we were on our way in less than an hour.

The technicians explained that the controller has two circuits, one for low-pressure appliances and one for the high-consumption generator. Apparently, the high-pressure side was faulty. Earlier in the week the service center had encountered a similar failure with similar good results after a new propane controller was installed.

I know controller is not the correct name for the device that controls propane flow but hopefully you do! Thank you for your advice.

Thank you for sharing your experience with your LP-gas genset. The device you refer to is commonly called a pressure regulator. We don't hear of many problems with propane units, as you don't have gummed-up carburetors from storage, water in the fuel and other difficulties common with gasoline-powered units. However, once in a while oil or moisture in the propane clogs the regulator. Refer to the Onan manual for this problem.

## May the Fourth Be with You

Hop aboard your Millennium Falcon and celebrate the 40th anniversary of "Star Wars" on location

f you're looking to start a long-running debate on your next road trip, just bring up the topic of the "Star Wars" movies. Pick a theme, any theme — best episode, favorite character, most memorable dialogue — and you're likely to get as many different answers as there are genuine stars in our own firmament.

By far the biggest news to hit the "Star Wars" universe though will be the upcoming opening of the new "Star Wars"-themed worlds at Southern California's Disneyland and Disney's Hollywood Studios in Orlando, Florida. The parks have been tight-lipped so far about the opening date, but rumors are they will swing open their blast doors later this year. In the meantime, you can build your own lightsaber at Tomorrowland's Star Trader shop, and even sign your young 'uns up as Padawans in the nearby Jedi Training Academy.

No matter where you go to celebrate this momentous anniversary, all we can say is — that's right, you guessed it — may the force be with you as you set out to travel The Road Ahead.


